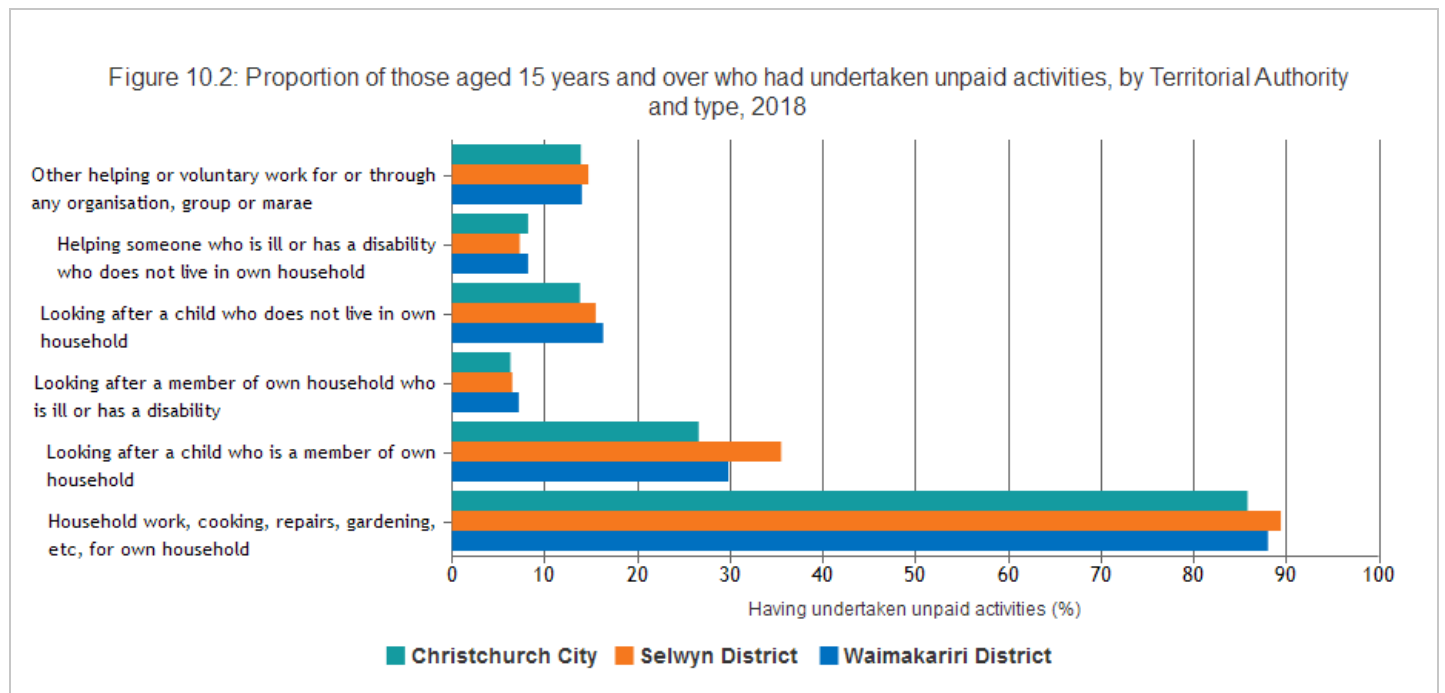


## Unpaid activities: Breakdown by Territorial Authority
